London Road offers good quality, residential care for up to eight people. A large, recently redecorated home, it has excellent facilities and an Activities Co-ordinator offering oneto-one sessions as well as group activities.

Residents get on well and recently went on holiday together to a specialist outdoor activity centre. Their ages currently vary between 40 to 80 years old.

Staff are experienced in supporting people with mobility and sensory impairments, and have robust systems for communicating with people who do not use words.

We support people with various activities, both within the home and in the community. These may be on an individual basis or as part of a group. The Activities Co-ordinator helps people to organise these with staff support.
