Our aim at Abbey House is to offer the highest standards of professional care and comfort in a warm and friendly environment. We take a holistic approach to providing care and support to each resident, meaning it is important to us that we get to know our residents and their families, enabling us to deliver care that wraps around the individual.

Abbey House has been designed with every stage of elder and dementia care in mind and our hope is that this brochure provides you with the information needed to either help you with your decision to choose us, or answer any questions you may have before moving in.

About Abbey House

The home provides nursing and residential services for up to 73 residents over three floors, which have been split into a total of six communities that each has their own unique character. Brunel Way, Blunsdon Manor, Lydiard Park, Coate Park, Pipers Way and Highworth Lodge each benefit from their own lounge/diner and kitchenette area and assisted bathroom.

Abbey House has been designed in line with Stirling Dementia standards and has been decorated to a high standard to ensure it is welcoming, bright and airy throughout. All bedrooms are for single use and have their own en-suite shower room and include a nurse call system, TV and telephone point.

On the ground floor there is a community café area which is available to be used by local groups, with the first floor home to a hairdressers and a quiet room available for the use of residents and visitors.

Abbey House also benefits from having an on-site therapy room to accommodate chiropody, physiotherapy and other services.

The nursing and care team

We provide 24 hour nursing care and can support people with Dementia, general health needs, and end of life care. Our nursing and care team is headed by a Registered Nurse Manager, who in turn is assisted by a team of nurses and care assistants. The team wear a uniform and name badges so that they are easily recognisable by residents and visitors to the home.

The full in-house nursing service provided at Abbey House enables the team to meet the care needs at every stage of the dementia journey and ensure the continuity of a resident's care.

Food at Abbey House

We understand the importance of a healthy balanced diet and the need to provide nutritious food using fresh, seasonal produce.

Whilst we work to set meal times to assist the on-site kitchen team, we always ensure there are a selection snacks and drinks on offer throughout the day and night.

The kitchenette area in each of the communities allows for residents to retain their independence for as long as possible, through continuing to engage with everyday activities like helping to make a cup of tea or with the washing up.
