Leader of the Labour party– Jeremy Corbyn

1. Invest in free personal care to ensure that all older people meet the needs for their personal care and to extend the provision to all working-age adults.
2. Develop eligibility criteria to tackle complex conditions
3. Spend no more than £100K on catastrophic care (an individual)
4. Invest in care packages (Double the number of people receiving care packages or reverse the damage of the spending cuts)
5. Higher standards for awarding organisations for providing care (quality care and ethical delivery, transparency, compliance, & profit capping)

Liberal Democrats



Leader of the Liberal Democrats– Jo Swinson

What have they said they are going to do?

1. Development of a progressive health and care by other tax reductions, to set the spending on social care and health transparent.
2. Establish a cross-party on health and social care convention to reach agreement on the long-term sustainable funding.
3. Introduce a statutory independent budget monitoring body for health and care to report if the spending was efficient.
4. Increase spending on NHS by increasing income tax and invest in *equipment, hospitals, community, ambulance and mental health services buildings*

1. Invest £4.5 billion in social care
2. Free personal care for people aged 65 and over- “a major investment for the elderly and all those who need it”
3. Introduce mental health awareness training within the public sector and encourage a more open dialogue on the issue in the wider society- put on par with physical health
